<u>Introduction from the chair</u>: Josie welcomed everyone, asked us all to introduce ourselves, and explained the History Group's concerns regarding the future.

Possible future projects:

Update of the Church leaflet in East Hagbourne: Joy Napper agreed to work on this.

East Hagbourne's website: need to update contradictory information regarding the fire and the fact that East and West Hagbourne have always been separate. This has now been changed by members from East Hagbourne, who also agreed to look at the story about the church bellcote (reference West Hagbourne's Village History book, Windsor Hakeborne)

Open Archive Day: History Group to display completed projects and archive holdings for benefit of the village.

Discussion: The future of West Hagbourne History Group

Several options and possibilities were considered and it was felt that we should not disband the History Group but take time to finish what we are doing by holding working parties instead of meetings. Mary expressed the importance of recording today's history by collecting photos and descriptions of current events.

The storage of material was discussed, including the possible purchase of lockable metal boxes to store important documents, photographs, etc. Mary Napper, a librarian at Didcot library kindly agreed to ask about the possibility of storing copies of maps and manuscripts at Didcot Library. Mary Wiley proposed that we give a list to Mary Napper after gathering them together at a working party.

Betty Kendrick suggested that the Village Association could help to promote our History Group by displaying it's work for an evening. We appreciated having input from Mary, Joy, Beth (who has taken on the task of East Hagbourne's archives), and Yen from East Hagbourne. They expressed the hope of encouraging more people to participate in village history and possibly form a group in the future.
