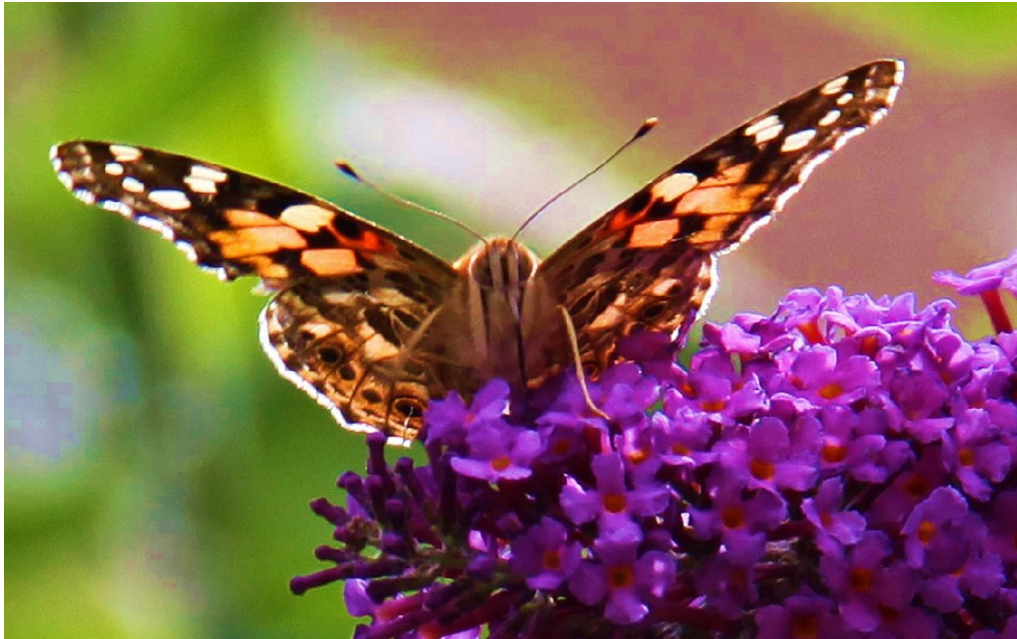

Rector's Reflections

A Glimpse of Heaven

I wonder if you fancy a glimpse of Heaven? Glimpses of Heaven can come upon us in so many different ways, and they are often quite unexpected. For example, we might be going for a walk on a dull or wet day, and then suddenly the sun comes out and the scene in front of us is bathed in glorious light, and we feel that we have entered a different realm. We know the experience will be temporary, but while it lasts, our hearts are full of joy. It is a glimpse of Heaven!

In early August, we will have the opportunity to experience a glimpse of Heaven in our own local area. To be precise, this experience will be available at St Andrew's Hagbourne on Saturday 8th August, between 5.30pm and 6.30pm. It will take the form of a special Choral Evensong featuring the music of two great British Composers: Charles Villiers Stanford (1852 -1924) and Herbert Howells (1892 -1983). Stanford was born in Ireland but he spent his professional life in England, where he taught at the Royal College of Music. He was a prolific composer, and had a particular gift for writing choral music. Howells had a similar gift for choral music. Both Stanford and Howells wrote organ music as well.

There is no charge to attend this Choral Evensong. It is offered as an act of worship to God, in celebration of a feast in the Church's year called the Feast of the Transfiguration. All are welcome to attend - it is an experience open to Christian and non-Christian alike. It uses traditional words and beautiful music to take us all on a journey from this world to the world beyond: to give us a glimpse of Heaven. And if you are unfamiliar with the music of Stanford and Howells, all I can say is that you are in for a treat! - *Father Jason*

A Thanksgiving Service was held at St Paul's followed by a national conference in London. Here, locally, we have displayed our MU banners in Blewbury Church and said special prayers in Churches across the Benefice.

In this article for July & August I want to stress how MU is a grass roots organisation. Each member has a part to play. Here in the Churn Benefice, we take "Christian concern for families worldwide" right to the local level. After the pandemic we started a monthly baby and toddler group we call **Coffee & Kids**, supporting parents and enabling our very youngest children to begin to interact with others. In August we hold a **Teddy Bears Picnic**, located in a secure private garden. Families bring picnics and we provide ice-cream and drinks with balloons to take home. We also organise a weekly coffee morning called the **"Drop In"**, Wednesdays, 10.30am – 12 noon at the Blewbury Benefice centre to meet others and chat together. This scarecrow display was the overwhelming favourite of all our voters although many of you will have seen that the field of 36 scarecrows was a really strong one. What a fabulous display it was!

The winner of the Action Group Award was **'Decoding Life'** created by Ruth Elderfield and hosted by Pat Elderfield of 98 New Road. This was in recognition of 'Decoding Life' being a very original creation which included scarecrows of three historically significant women - Mary Anning, Ada Lovelace and Rosalind Franklin - which was supported by some excellent information sheets explaining who they were, what they achieved and why the work of these women mattered so much. This came second overall in the competition too.

Third place went to **'Sir David Attenborough'** created by The Fleur de Lys. Very apt in view of Sir David having just passed his 100th birthday!

Our feathered friends

The results of a new global assessment published at the end of last year, show that more than half of bird species globally are in decline. Here in the UK, we have wealth of citizen science data along with research studies that tell us that many of our bird species are declining even faster.

The category of birds declining most steeply since the 1970s are farmland birds down by 62% – corn buntings, turtle doves, tree sparrows and more. Intensive agriculture (and especially increasing pesticide and fertiliser use), lack of overwinter habitat like winter stubble and adequate hedging all play their part.

Woodland birds are down by a third over the same period, nightingales, wood warblers and others. Changes in woodland management and climate change are both drivers.

House sparrows, starlings and skylarks are some of the worst hit species and all are common to our local area here. UK gardens make up more space collectively than all of the nature reserves in the UK put together. If you want to help our local birdlife survive, here are some things you can do in your garden this summer –

- Create a wildflower patch – either plant one or just let grass grow long. This supports insects that birds rely on for food.
- Avoid using pesticides, the insect life you spare is then food for birds, especially caterpillars for the later broods of baby birds.
- Put out fresh water for birds every day.
- Leave cutting hedges and shrubs (plus any tree thinning work) until mid-January, just before they start budding again. Shorn and clipped hedges leave no place for birds and insects to shelter over winter. And when hedges are cut and trees removed in the nesting seasons it leads to unnecessary bird deaths.
- Don't cut back all seed heads at the end of summer – leave at least some for the seedeaters like sparrows to enjoy over autumn.
- Plan for autumn planting of native hedges – e.g. hawthorn, blackthorn and holly to give home and food to more birds in your garden.

SEA SUNDAY – 12th July Sea Sunday is the day each year when churches worldwide come together to pray for seafarers, and to support The Mission to Seafarers' frontline ministry to them. Seafarers are essential to everyday life, yet many work unseen, facing long periods away from home, isolation, and often dangerous conditions. Sea Sunday offers an opportunity to pause and give thanks for the men and women who keep our world moving.

The Mission to Seafarers works in ports across the world. In 2025 alone, it made over 48,000 ship visits, provided shore leave transport for more than 150,000 seafarers, and ran programmes on family support and suicide prevention. These moments of care — a visit on board, practical help ashore, or someone to listen — can make a profound difference to seafarers far from home.

For Sea Sunday 2026, the theme is 'Harbours of Hope: The Church Alongside Seafarer', inspired by Matthew 25. This theme celebrates the local church as a place of welcome, refuge, and hope - a community offering both spiritual and practical safety to those who work at sea. It invites congregations to reflect on how they can stand alongside seafarers through prayer, hospitality, generosity, and justice. <https://www.missiontoseafarers.org>

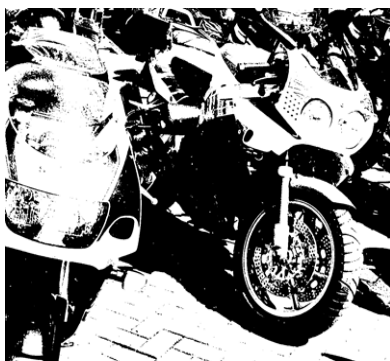

## Comments from the East Hagbourne Parish Council Chairman

**Roadworks** You have certainly been aware of the extensive road works and resurfacing on Blewbury Road and part of New Road. Several people have remarked that Main Road between the village and Coscote is arguably in a worse state and should have had priority for resurfacing. We have been talking with the County Council for some time trying to get significant work done on the Coscote Road. Apparently, there are a range of criteria for the prioritization. These include: The classification of the road. Blewbury/New are a B road, Main Road is unclassified. The traffic volumes are not at a threshold. Indeed, in the data collected recently (after full occupation of St Andrews Crescent) for positioning of speed signage, traffic was around half the threshold. Other metrics are the number of buses and the number of Fix My Street requests. I mention the former below and mention again that it really is important to report any road issues, not only potholes of depth greater than 40mm, to Fix My Street ([www.fixmystreet.com](http://www.fixmystreet.com)).

**Bus services in the village** Our Parish Transport Representative, Joy Napper, and David Bellchamber from OCC have been discussing the placement of bus stops in the village. The old days of stop on demand are no longer supported so it is important to get more bus stops in the village to reduce distances people have to travel to the nearest stop. The discussion is going well although final approval is still needed with OCC and the bus companies. At the moment, on the proposal list are: Stops in both directions on New Road near the Crescent, Stops in both directions by Parsonage Lane on Main Road, Stop at bus shelter by War Memorial for going out of village and hopefully another coming in but nearer to Higgs Close. Stop by the lay by at bottom of Blewbury Road, and the existing one in both directions further up Blewbury Road. Noting that only one sign is needed if the stop is in both directions. Other locations, for example near Upper Cross have been proposed but have been refused because of traffic and safety concerns. Having a stop near the new housing at St Andrew's Crescent is still being discussed. The long term hope might be that better provision and clarity of stops might encourage more people to use this facility and, in the future, more bus provision, perhaps helping our Main Road resurfacing prioritization. And talking of the bus shelter, it will soon house some marvellous artwork from our resident artist, Linda Benton.

**Speed Signage** At last night's (18th June) Parish Council meeting decisions were taken to go ahead with getting the poles installed by OCC and for us to purchase and install the Speed Signs. Hopefully, these should be in place in the summer: on the entries to the village on Main Road and Blewbury Road, to complement the one already after the entry on New Road, and two in both directions in Blewbury Road and one coming into the village in the 20mph zone on New Road. The signs will enable us to monitor speeds and inform both us and a future Speedwatch team.

**Post Office** The minister has answered the parliamentary petition with the normal comment that they don't intervene in particular cases, but his tone is quite sympathetic leading our MP's Team to contemplate keeping the campaign going.

**Parish Surgeries** I will not be holding any parish surgery in July and presently do not plan any for August. I will, however, no doubt be in the Fleur and around the village so feel free to contact me in person or by email ([iain.duff@easthagbourne.net](mailto:iain.duff@easthagbourne.net)), or indeed the clerk **or any other councillor should you have any concerns.**

**Parish Council meetings** The next meeting of East Hagbourne Parish Council will be held in the Pavilion in the Recreation Ground starting at 7.30pm on Thursday 16th July. Members of the public are welcome, indeed encouraged; to attend the meeting and the agenda is posted on the Parish Council noticeboard outside the Community Shop and on the village website <https://easthagbourne.net/parish-council/meetings-minutes-agendas/> at least three clear days before the meeting. There will be no Council meeting in August.

## **Lunar Kites set controls for Doctor Who gig on 5th July at The Fleur**

Following the success of last summer's Doctor Who-themed concert in East Hagbourne, space rockers Lunar Kites are set to do it all again in 2026. This year's gig will take place at the Fleur de Lys pub at 3pm on Sunday 5th July, outside event – no tickets required.

The event marks the anniversary of the Tom Baker story, *The Android Invasion*, which was filmed in East Hagbourne in July 1975.

"We were delighted with how many people - Whovians and non fans alike - turned out for last year's gig at East Hagbourne village hall. So, we thought we'd jump into our Tardis and set the coordinates for 2026," said guitarist Tim Masters, who lives in West Hagbourne. "We're excited that this year's venue will be the Fleur de Lys pub, which was used as a key location in *The Android Invasion*. ## **Bus service to the Churchill, Nuffield and Warneford Hospitals**

**The bus to catch for any of these hospitals from the centre of Oxford is number 15 which is every 1/4 hour during the day, taking 10-12 minutes, longer at busy times.**

You can catch it near the entrance to the Covered Market or near Queen's Lane. Those stops work whether you're connecting from Didcot with the Thames Travel X32 or, quicker but more walking, using the train from Didcot. The set down points are announced on the bus; for the Warneford, Warneford Road; for the Churchill, Roosevelt Drive; for the Nuffield, the stop is further on, called Lime Walk, and is actually in Old Road near the Old Road entrance to the hospital. **The website for the 15** is <https://www.oxfordbus.co.uk/services/OXBC/15>, where you can also find a useful bus map and even live information. When using the X32 to Oxford, it's also possible to connect with the 15 near the Police Station, generally fewer people trying to get on at once.

## **Thames Travel bus service to Oxford and the JR Hospital from Didcot – X32**

The X32 service starts at Cockcroft Road, Didcot, which might be a convenient point for some people to catch it - every 20 minutes. It then goes to GWP South and down Wantage Road, past Didcot Hospital, to the Orchard Centre, Station, and on to Oxford and the JR.

**Useful extra 94 bus on Saturdays** There is a bus, just on Saturdays, at 8.45am from the Lower Cross East Hagbourne to the Didcot Orchard Centre and Didcot Station.
